(NEAUDD GOCH BANK WIND FARM)**

INTRODUCTION

RWE npower renewables Ltd are seeking consent for a 9 turbine wind farm with an installed capacity of up to 27MW at land to the south of Dolfor, Newtown Powys. The scheme is known as “Neaudd Goch Bank Wind Farm”.

Neaudd Goch Bank Wind Farm is located to the north of the Llanbadarn Fynydd wind farm (application made by Vattenfall) and the proposed installation of a 132kv overhead electric line from the proposed Llandinam Wind Farm to Welshpool Substation (application made by SPEN MANWEB PLC) passes across part of the Neaudd Goch Bank site.

RWE npower renewables have submitted a written representation objecting to the proposed 132kv overhead electric line from the proposed Llandinam Wind Farm to Welshpool Substation (letter dated 17/12/2009).

The Neaudd Goch Bank Wind Farm application was submitted to Powys County Council for determination under The Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (ref: P/2012/0040) and is yet to be determined.

Due to the proximity of Neaudd Goch Bank Wind Farm to the aforementioned applications, there is potential for cumulative effects to occur. The Neaudd Goch Bank Wind Farm environmental statement assesses these cumulative effects. Given the proximity of the schemes, the interactions between and the potential deleterious effect of them it is recognised that such issues are likely to be subject of examination at the Public Inquiry. As such, RWE npower renewables Ltd wishes to reserve its position to participate at the Inquiry.
