To Claire Jones-Hughes:

We would like to recommend that the proposed conjoined public inquiry be held at either Newtown or Welshpool to enable more of the affected people to be able to attend. Llandrindod Wells is rather an outpost in Powys. Would it also be possible for transmission lines to and from the hub, and even the hub itself, to be included in the inquiry, along with flooding and hydrology implications?

There are many public footpaths, including Glyndwrs Way and Offas Dyke, that would be adversely affected by these constructions, as well as other tourist businesses and householders.

It is understood that the inspector, A.D.Poulter, is planning on visiting communities within the proposed wind farm sites, so would it be possible to hold consultations in these sites?

A concession under rule 19 (5) to allow third party objectors to cross examine witnesses would also be appreciated.
