Good afternoon

I write to express concern that the following issues be included in the Inquiry:

1. Although National Grid have yet to announce details of their connection from the proposed wind farms to the grid, it is inevitable that the connection will have to be made if the wind farms should be approved. I believe it is essential that the intended connection to the grid should be conjoined with the wind farm inquiry since the two issues are inter-dependant. Several serious issues arise with regards to the grid connection.
2. There is concern that with the huge volumes of concrete required for each of the proposed turbines, access road infrastructure etc. that flooding will more readily result. Flooding is already an issue.
3. The area is heavily reliant on tourism and there is particular local anxiety about the likely effect that the proposed developments will have on this vital element of our economy.
