Information to help you with the survey

Windfarms

The public enquiry will consider developers' applications for 5 large wind farms in Llanbrynmair, Carnedd Wen, Llanbararn Fynydd, Llaithddu and Llandinam. There are other applications pending.

The five applications are for a total of approximately 150 large turbines.

Transport

To construct a single turbine will require about eight, "Abnormal Indivisible Loads" Each will need a police escort of several vehicles and will involve road closures. Over the construction period of the five wind farms this will involve well over 1000 of these convoys. This is addition to the Heavy Goods Vehicle movements involved with the construction. Making the concrete bases alone could generate well in excess of 1000 HGV movements.

The Llandinam pylon line

In order to export the electricity from the re-powering Llandinam wind farm Scottish Power have applied to build a separate transmission line that will pass through the communities of Dolfor and Kerry on its way to Welshpool. The majority of the pylons would be would be large double wooden pole structures 14m (44 ft) high and operate at 132,000 Volts.
